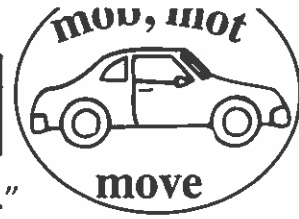


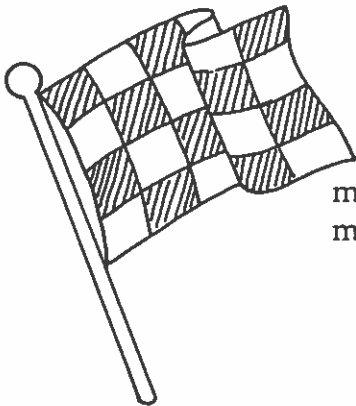
Power Under the Hood

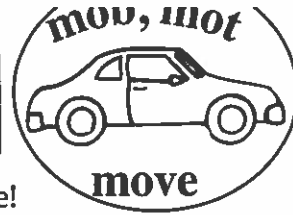
The warnings and directions given here belong somewhere on the map of Motion City below. For each one, draw a circle in the correct spot and label with the matching sign number.
